Labour Force Statistics

Labour Force Statistics provides detailed statistics on population, labour force, employment and unemployment, broken down by gender, as well as unemployment duration, employment status, employment by sector of activity and part-time employment. It also contains participation and unemployment rates by gender and detailed age groups, as well as comparative tables for the main components of the labour force. The data are available as an annual publication, a CD-ROM and an online database.

OECD Employment Outlook

The *OECD Employment Outlook* is the OECD's annual assessment of labour market developments and prospects in its member countries. Along with an overview of the main issues and challenges, each edition addresses a selection of topical themes in more detail. Previous topics covered include: trade adjustment costs and regional disparities in OECD labour markets; cross-country variations in working hours; and, most recently, the reassessed OECD Jobs Strategy. Each *Employment Outlook* also includes a comprehensive statistical annex with main data on employment, unemployment and the labour market.

Achieving a successful balance between family life and work is a key goal for both individuals and society. Parents, governments and employers have many - sometimes conflicting - needs, such as the ability to earn an income and care for family, the necessity to maximise labour supply, and the responsibility to invest in child development for the good of future societies. 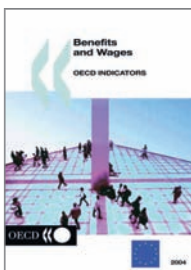
Local Economic and Employment Development

Meeting this challenge will require major reforms of social security systems, employment regulations and firm practices. In addition, employers, unions and governments need to look beyond stereotypes and modernise work practices so that older workers stay in the labour market. *Ageing and Employment Policies* is a book series which looks in detail at the employment prospects of older workers and the policies in place in individual countries. It comprises 21 country reports plus a synthesis report *Live Longer, Work Longer*.

Benefits and Wages: OECD Indicators



Unemployment and related welfare benefits help prevent those without work from falling into poverty but at the same time, reduce the incentive to work; this is one of the main dilemmas of social policy. This biennial report, allows comparisons of the welfare benefits available to those in and out of work as well as the taxes they are liable to pay. Total household incomes and their components are calculated for a range of family types and employment situations. The results are used to examine financial incentives to work, either part-time or full-time, as well as the extent to which social benefits prevent income poverty for those without a job.
